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

## Annual Report 2013-14

2013-14 was an eventful year for CDR. With assistance from the Society for Elimination of Rural Poverty (SERP) under the Scheduled Caste Sub Plan, CDR helped the mothers open 550 new ECE schools in the SC habitations in 9 districts in the first quarter of 2014. This is in addition to 661 schools already functioning under the ECE programme. A total of 18,423 children were enrolled in these schools.







Pre Primary Percentage distribution of 3 yr & 4 yr pupil





Percentage distribution of Girls & Boys






#### Percentage distribution of social groups






#### Percentage distribution of Girls & Boys


#### Year wise progress of ECE programme



Month wise attendance percentage of Pre Primary class – Maa Vooru Maa Badi - 2013-14





Month wise attendance percentage of Class 2 - 2013-14






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### Learning outcomes

The Teachers in the schools and the Resource Persons at the Custer and District levels worked hard to deliver the daily diet of joyful learning to the children in every school. Community Governance was also strengthened during the year. A well thought out lesson plan, systematic training for teachers every month, continuous support and guidance to the teachers and close involvement of the parents in the governance of the school, together, have helped to achieve good learning outcomes during the year.

Assessment of learning outcomes of the SC Sub Plan schools, except in Adilabad district, was not possible as the schools commenced functioning during the last quarter of the academic year after overcoming the resistance of the Anganwadi Workers who agitated against the schools.

#### Trainings

**Foundation Course Training (FCT):** Every selected teacher attends a Foundation Course Training for 16 days in activity based joyful teaching methodology. It includes a three day stay in a MVMB school. The trainee interacts with the community also and learns about the parents' role in community governance.

**Monthly Lesson Plan training (MLP):** Every teacher is trained for two days every month in teaching of the next month's Lesson Plan.

During 2013-14, CDR conducted 16 days Foundation Course Training for 762 newly recruited school teachers and CRPs in 20 batches. It also conducted 2 day Monthly Lesson Plan trainings every month for all the teachers.

## Maa Vooru Maa Badi – Our Village Our School Impact of the programme

The community governed ECE school programme pioneered by CDR and funded by SERP since 2008 has provided joyful education to 18423 children in 1200 villages during the year 2013-14. It is spread over tribal areas of Adilabad, Warangal, Mahabubnagar, East Godavari districts and in equally interior Scheduled Caste habitations in Karimnagar, Nalgonda, Ranga Reddy, Nizamabad, Krishna and Medak districts. Community participation and ownership have become the hall mark of this programme. The mothers have named the school as *Maa Vooru Maa Badi* or Our Village Our School. The mothers in Adilabad district call the programme *Mava Nate Mava Sada*. The School Committee and the Mandala Mahila Samakyas have proved to be the biggest strength for ensuring effective functioning of these schools in some of the most far flung areas in the State.

Society for Elimination of Rural Poverty (SERP), our partner organization has been an unstinting supporter of the concept of community governance. It never spared any effort in extending necessary guidance and opportunity to CDR for implementing this programme. CDR is grateful to the CEO and his colleagues in SERP for making this happen.

The ECE programme has provided enormous joy to thousands of children in helping them to learn and prepare for formal education. The well structured lesson plan adopted by the ECE schools gave more than ample time to the children for creative activities, nature watching, story telling, song and play. The school built basic confidence in the child to talk and carry on a conversation. It sowed the seeds of curiosity in the child to question and to know. The children also inculcated personality moulding good habits.

This programme has also provided a great opportunity for educated women from the vulnerable sections in the villages to make a valuable contribution. After selection and working as teachers, they have completely transformed their personality and attained a pre-eminent position in their villages. All the teachers brim with new found confidence and a strong sense of self esteem. The services of these teachers are now often sought by the community for different purposes also. Similarly, the Cluster Resource Persons who are also identified by the community are widely respected for their role in supporting and guiding the teachers and the school committees.

The ECE schools that are taking care of the child for the whole day have made it possible for hundreds of mothers to go for work and earn an extra wage for the family. In scores of families the ECE school released the older girl sibling from the responsibility of attending to her younger brother or sister and helped her to go to a school herself.

### **Child Education Sponsorship**

CDR is finding donors who wish to contribute their bit in providing 10 years of continuous education to children from vulnerable groups. During the last four years 63 children belonging to different Scheduled Tribes from three districts of Adilabad, Warangal and Mahabubnagar are receiving support from donor partners. All are admitted in Class I in Sarada Vidhyadhamam, a residential school of high values in Hyderabad.

#### **Peoples Plantation Programme (PPP)**

CDR worked with the State Government and the local administration along with the Mandala Mahila Samakyas to design and implement the Peoples Plantation Programme (PPP) in 5 mandals in Adilabad, and 3 mandals in Warangal districts. The PPP covered 1691 farmers in all mandals. The entire programme is financed under the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGS). It is planned to cover 500 acres in each mandal during 2014-15. Peoples Nurseries of 50,000 plants in each are being grown by the Mandala Samakya in each identified mandal for this purpose.

The salient features of the PPP are:

- 1. It is implemented completely in rain fed areas and is aimed to provide enduring source of income.
- 2. Only non timber economically valuable species are grown. The farmer makes the choice of the plants to be grown on her land.
- 3. It is implemented by the Mandala Mahila Samakyas.
- 4. It has been designed by CDR based on its past experience and was canvassed vigorously with the State government for approval of the people centred policy.
- 5. All plant care activities are supported till the plants come to yield.
- 6. It is entirely funded under the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGS).

A booklet giving all details of PPP is enclosed. The district and mandal wise details of PPP are shown in the Table below.
